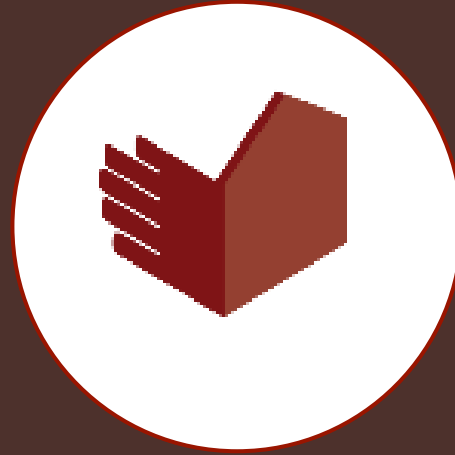

**The security situation in the country remains volatile.** The Libyan National Army (LNA) remains positioned in Sirt (455 km east of Tripoli) and Aljufra in central Libya while the Government of National Accord (GNA) continues to control major western areas in the country such as Tripoli and surrounding cities. The Acting Special Representative of the Secretary-General said in December that **10 military bases** in Libya were either fully or partially occupied by foreign forces, and that there were **20,000 foreign forces and/or mercenaries** in the country. On 22 January, Satellite images published by CNN showed a 10 kms-long trench dug by what it claimed were “Russian mercenaries” near the frontline coastal city of Sirt. **As of 23 January, the deadline for foreign mercenaries and troops to depart Libyan passed with no action taken.** On 28 January, the United States called for the immediate withdrawal of Russian and Turkish forces from Libya.

**On 30 January, (UNSMIL)** announced the list of candidates for the **Presidency Council and Prime Minister**; **on 5 February**, the Libyan Political Dialogue Forum (**LPDF**) voted for the list one: **Mohamed Menfi as interim Presidency Council head, and Abdul Hamid Mohammed Dbeibah, as interim prime minister.** The House of Representatives (**HoR**) must approve the newly-selected executive authority in 21 days, failing to do so, the decision would go to the LPDF members. The new interim executive authority pledged to respect the LPDF Roadmap with regard to the preparatory period paving the way for the **national elections on December 24, 2021**

**The rate of Coronavirus (COVID-19) cases continues to grow rapidly in Libya.** As of 7 February, the National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) recorded **5,400 new Coronavirus cases for** a total of **124,882 cases** of COVID-19, out of whom **17,486** are active cases, **105,422** recovered and **1,974 deaths.**

**On 7 February** Dr Sulieman Abusrewil, Deputy head of **Libya’s Scientific Advisory Committee to Combat the Coronavirus Pandemic** said Libya has secured **55,000 Pfizer and 920,000 AstraZeneca vaccine doses.** The target group for vaccination is the group most vulnerable: people over the age of 60, people suffering from chronic diseases, as well as medical staff.

**As of 8 February**, a total of **1,905 refugees and migrants** have been registered as rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard (LCG) and disembarked in Libya in 2021. UNHCR and its partner, IOM, IRC remain present at disembarkation points to provide urgent medical assistance and core relief items (CRIs).

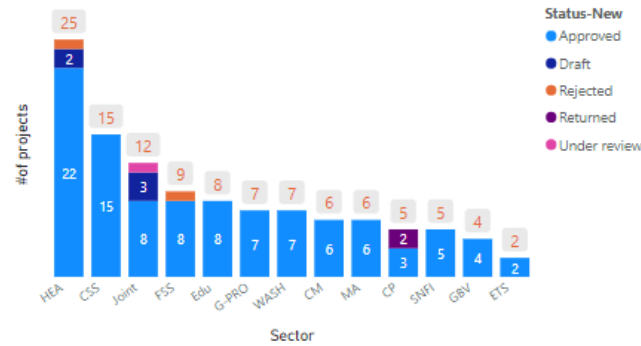

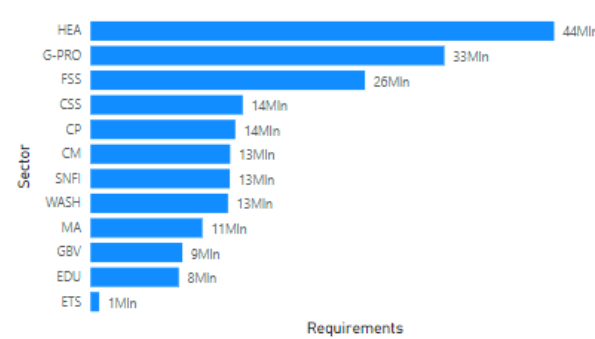

Projects by sector and status



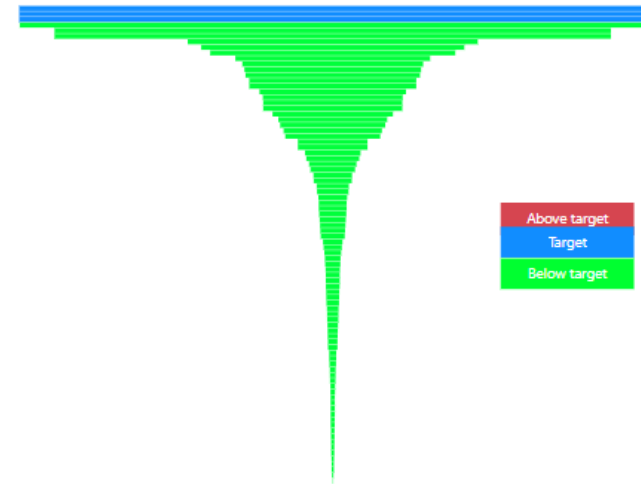
Requirements by sector



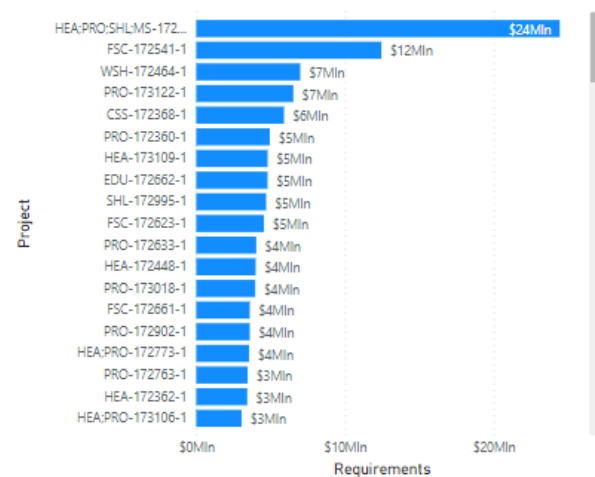

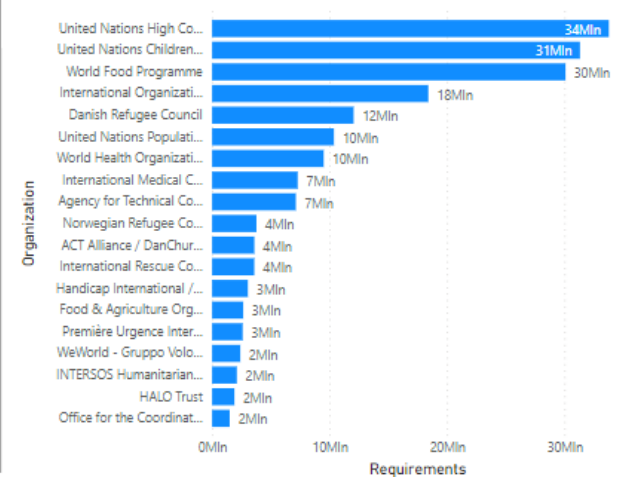
Target for each project

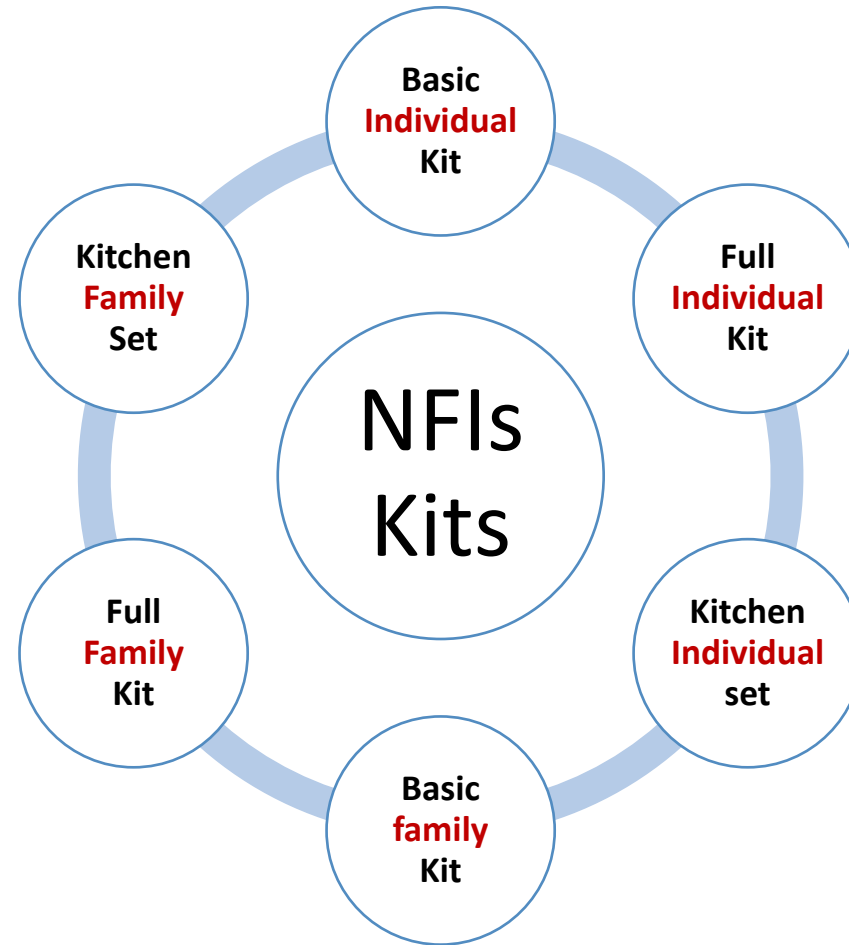

  - Scenario 4: Eviction or ‘departures under duress’ are unavoidable
  - Scenario 5: Major protection risks (threats or acts of violence, especially GBV)
  - Scenario 6: mass eviction from collective centers/sites/camps
- **Protection assistance framework**
  - GBV, PSEA, MHPSS, Discrimination, Child protection, Persons with disabilities, Elderly people
- **Shelter assistance framework**
  - Cash for Rent, Flexible Housing Assistance: (minor upgrade of the propriety), Upgrading substandard WASH facilities (substantial upgrade), Renewable energy/solar water heaters
- **Durable solution**
- **Referral mechanism**
  - Legal assistance, Health, Education

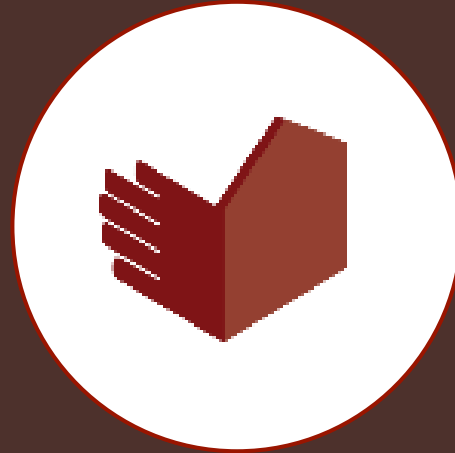
