3	<p>Updates from The Sector</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> General security, context and COVID updates Global shelter cluster Rental Market Interventions document will be launched on the 15th of Dec <p>Updates on the HRP process</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Updates on the HRP- 7 projects with a total envelope of 13,177,899 USD submitted. Partners who submitted projects are ACTED, CESVI, DRC, IOM, NRC, UNHCR Partners are encouraged to share any complaints and feedback regarding the PM process, some of the issues mentioned are; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> IT issues and losing some of the inputs due to technical issues No consideration regarding what part of fund was already secured and the overall envelope Suggestion to consider performance from previous years when reviewing projects and assigning envelopes per agency Tight deadline The process was smooth and the introduction to the system was adequate and allowed good understanding of how the system works Updates regarding to the eviction in Janzour <p>On 20th of November Protection Sector informed about the risk of eviction for 96 HH and more families in Janzour</p> <p>OCHA West ACG and reached all the Sectors and partners for coordinate the response. Action point decided and taken so far: were decided:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assessment and data analysis, done Draft advocacy note to authorities by PS- done Shelter sector contacted OCHA for facilitating meeting with Municipality on finding alternative shelter options. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MHPSS WG: referrals for MHPSS support after physical safety/immediate needs addressed ensured • NRC: referrals for legal aid, civil documentation, counselling on lease agreement negotiations • IOM: post eviction NFI support <p>Several meetings were planned but always cancelled by the authorities for different reasons. Thank you to OCHA negotiations with MI, MIDP and MoSA, the eviction has been postponed twice to the end of November and 31st of December</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Updates regarding release from DC's <p>325 individuals were supposed to be released from Zintan DC in small groups starting from the 7th till the 16th of December to Serraj and CDC, and additional 76 individuals from Aby Eissa on the 10th. Negotiations were on going since October between the authorities DCIM, OCHA, UNHCR, IOM, WFP and other relevant actors. On the night of the 6h the DCIM communicated that they were not in position to ensure the escort for the secure transportation thus the release was cancelled. Spontaneous release of groups of individuals started anyway. Requests of support for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • shelter assistance in urban areas by identifying and securing adequate shelter • caregiving assistance for the most vulnerable (only 6 up to 10 already identified by CESVI) • Emergency cash assistance for one month after release, to be followed by an assessment for regular cash assistance. <p>Challenges</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lack of adequate accommodation • Limited number of families keen to host (duration may be an issue) • Cash liquidity <p>UNHCR and CESVI have been coordinating with community volunteers to support the identification of private accommodation to rent and caregivers. In meetings held in the last days, DRC shared their willingness to complement with cash (as per their capacity) and HKs (if needed) to urban package already prepared by UNHCR, IOM, WFP MSF, IRC, CESVI; while IOM confirmed the availability of covering NFI gaps.</p>	<p>Meeting with local authorities (pending)</p> <p>Preparation on going</p>	
4	<p>Updates from the partners</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ACTED – Winterization kits distribution to 31 families in Tobruk on Dec 1. The distribution was based on needs assessment and conducted along with LibAid which brought heaters and winter clothing donated by UNHCR • CESVI – Continuing the door to door distribution of HKs and winter clothing kits in Misrata. 227 individuals received HKs in November.

	<p>Their stock is almost exhausted, purchasing for winter campaign and HH supplies on going. Distribution to IDPs planned between December and January at Ministry of Social Affair – Misrata branch (standard women clothing 35 – winter clothing women 104, winter clothing men 93 – winter clothing children 53, kitchen set 100, oil heaters 100). Remaining items will be distributed door-to-door.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• DRC – Beginning of December distribution of 1070 winter kits (900 male – 170 female) in Gargaresh 1-5, Al krimiya 1-2, Tajoiura and Souq AL Zuma. Distribution will continue at the end of December, sites to be identified as accumulated needs are 1295 vs 1070 available. Shelter rehabilitation: RETURNEES: 10 female in Yefren completed, 9 families in Aby Salim received materials, 4families in Yefren works will start 3rd week of Dec.; IDPs: FellaH 1-2 materials will arrive on 15 Dec. distribution and starting rehabilitation following.• REACH – informed about recent assessments and result will be shared with the partners during the next meeting in January.
