3	<b>Presentation on the shelter situation in AL Kufra by OCHA</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Many houses remain destroyed by the war and tribal fighting with families not able to undertake rehabilitation works due to limited financial resources</li><li>• According to information from the municipality, there are around 320 damaged houses in AL Kufra</li><li>• Many families remain unable to return and continue to be internally displaced due to their inability to restore their houses. Majority of IDP families reside in rented accommodation</li><li>• 2 Local NGO's are working in some areas aiming at rehabilitating houses (Libyan youth organization and Al Khansa organization). The scale of their projects are limited and can't cover all needs</li><li>• According to local organizations many families were not able to remain in Kufra and has moved north towards Ajdabia and Benghazi (around 150 people)</li></ul>	Partners interested in communicating with the local NGO's there should contact OCHA	
4	<b>Presentation of the new NFI technical guidelines</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• New guidelines provide general guidance on good practices for distribution and technical specifications on the composition of kits</li><li>• The Guidance note includes different NFI packages (basic NFI kit, full NFI kit, kitchen set, winter clothing, winter top up, summer to up)</li><li>• Guidance note will be shared with partners for revision and comments</li><li>• Suggestion from CESVI to have a unified post distribution monitoring tool to measure satisfaction following provision of NFI's. this suggestion will be considered by the TWIG</li></ul>	Partners to provide any comments on the guidance note to the sector

8	<p><b>Updates from Actors</b></p> <p><b>ACTED</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Receiving applications for CSO's training</li></ul> <p><b>DRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- 34 houses rehabilitations in Tripoli complete, works still ongoing in 16 houses and expected to be finished end of the month</li></ul> <p><b>CESVI</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- NFI Misrata distribution of kitchen sets to 100 IDP households in Misrata completed</li><li>- Continuing winterization plan providing winter clothing and blankets</li><li>- Ongoing distributions of Hygiene kits</li><li>- In January reached 450 individuals</li></ul> <p><b>NRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Vulnerability assessment for around 300 families in Tarhouna completed, provision of NFI kits expected in the coming 2 weeks</li><li>- Completed distribution of Hygiene Kits to 1,100 families in the east in IDP settlements</li><li>- Starting the process of identification of HH for shelter rehabs in Benghazi with plans to rehabilitate 100 houses in Benghazi in 2021</li><li>- Plans for rehabilitating 300 houses in Tripoli in 2021</li></ul> <p><b>UNHCR</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- UNHCR/LIBAID continued providing winter items for the IDPs in the western region and the Nafusa mountain, 2409 families, 13033 individuals reached so far.</li><li>- UNHCR with IOM conduct joint intervention at Al Mabani dc where up to 1130 individuals received NFIs.</li></ul>
