	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rehabilitation works in one medical center in Abu Salim- Tripoli (Al Mashro’o Al Zerai center) will start in November and will be finished by the end of the year.</li> <li>• Planned rehabilitation works in an additional 100 houses in Benina and AL Sabri in Benghazi.</li> <li>• Assessment for delivery of NFI kits in the east</li> </ul> <p><b>PUI</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 773 Hygiene kits and 769 NFI kits were distributed directly to the beneficiaries on a need evidences-based approach at the arrival of any detained individual in Ganfouda, Ajdabiya, Al Marj and Tolmaitha DC on October. Besides, PUI carried out 9 Post Distribution Monitoring to monitor PUI's distribution.</li> <li>• On September 23, 2020, PUI organized the donation of toilet papers and soap bars to the Department of Health Services (DHS) to target both Buatni PHCC and Al Fouilhat PHCC (covered by PUI through its Non-Communicable Diseases project) and Alhelees Polyclinic, recommended by the DHS as well as the donation of 4,284 feminine sanitary packs and soap bars to improve the personal hygiene of the 27 women located in an Orphan Center named Al Hawary female Orphan centre, next to Al Hawary Hospital (GPS: 32.051305 ‘ 20.108904), hosting currently 27 women.</li> </ul>		
3	<p><b>HRP discussion</b></p> <p><b>3.1 Update provided by the sector on the progress of the HRP framework so far</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SNFI envelope for 2021 is 13 million as assigned by OCHA. The SNFI submission after reduction went from 27 million to 13.4 million</li> <li>• Same three objectives as last year will be included in the HRP 2021.</li> <li>• The biggest part of 2021 costs (as submitted by partners) is NFI followed by rehab of houses then seasonal NFI then unfinished building and rehab of collective centres and other infrastructure projects.</li> </ul> <p><b>3.2 Next steps - PM</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Project module will be open on the 19th of November. To be confirmed</li> <li>• Project module platform will be open for submission from partners for 2 weeks.</li> <li>• Submitted projects will be vetted/evaluated by the sector.</li> <li>• The sector strongly recommends partners to start working on the submissions as soon as possible to allow for sufficient time for revisions.</li> <li>• A meeting/session will be held to go through the project module and answer any questions from partners related to the use of the platform.</li> <li>• Partners are encouraged to approach the sector with any questions or inquiries related to the HRP submissions for 2021.</li> </ul>	<p>Invitation to tutorial will be sent to HRP Partners</p>	<p>On going</p>
