5	<p>Updates from the sector</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - General update on the overall situation in Libya in the first weeks of March as reported by the Media (see presentation slide #9) - Detention centers map, with credit to UNHCR; in the West NFI distribution modalities have been stopped by the DCIM while in the East continue regularly. - GSC- end of year report published on the website - 2021 achievements vs targets (HRP and no-HRP) up to Feb 2021 (slide # 12) - Last appeals circulated by ACSs OCHA and key messages by PS (slides # 14) - ISCG workplan for 2021 and roadmap of incoming months (March -April) - Eviction Task Force -status of the works - SAG and TWIG, ongoing activities, deliverable developed and planned. - Reminders (slide # 19) - Humanitarian access constraints: partners were informed to delete old cases from the platform to prevent inaccuracies in reporting. - Common Feedback Mechanism, last updates as Feb 2021. 6	<p>Updates from the partners</p> <p>CEFA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - CEFA reported that no activities under SFNI assistance currently, however in the next months they may have plans which will be communicated timely. <p>DRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - In the ongoing month, 70 (M) Asylum seekers have been reached in Gargarsh (G5) under DIFID project, with improving site condition through rehabilitation intervention for shelter/WASH by using contactor modality. - DRC shelter has closed SDC project in January 2021, providing the following assistances: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • provision of shelter /Wash materials for improving the site condition, reached 159 NN Tawergha IDPs in Fallah 1 and 128 HH Tawergha IDPs in Fallah 2 		



	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Provision of shelter /Wash materials for improving their shelter conditions, reached 50 HH Returnees in South Tripoli, Azizya, and Alawinya (Nafosa mountain)• Improving site condition through rehabilitation intervention to respond to shelter/WASH gaps by using contactor modality, reached (150 Individuals) mixed migrants (Asylum seekers) in Garagarsh- (G1)• Provision of Fire extinguishers to (90HH) mixed Libyan IDPs in Njilla informal settlement <p>INTERSOS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- NFI distribution in Sebha implemented by local partners. 450 HH reached with different kind of NFI kits assistance: people with special needs (wheelchairs, hospital beds); children (diapers, clothes, toys); medical/hospital equipment (hospital bed, mattresses, bedding); HKs (personal hygiene and laundry set) <p>CESVI</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Concerning Door to Door distribution, Cesvi is continuing to assist Libyan and not Libyan households in the Urban Areas of Misrata with distribution of Hygiene kits, standard clothing kit, and blankets.- In terms of distributions in partnership with Local Authorities, we are negotiating with the Misrata branch of the Ministry of Social Affairs the target and distribution list for a distribution of household items and adult diapers.- In terms of Cash for Rent, in the month of March 2021, 23 HH are being supported with rental assistance. <p>NRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Completed distribution of NFI kits to 150 families in Tarhouna- Carrying over household level assessments in AL Sabri in Benghazi to identify beneficiaries for houses rehabilitation projects- Conducting assessments in Tripoli (Abu Salim) looking at potential infrastructure projects/support <p>UNHCR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- UNHCR completed the WP distribution plan for IDPs, where 3,238 families and 15,037 individuals received winter items in different cities and IDP camps.- With the support of partners, UNHCR managed to reach 1,278 families and 8,434 individuals' person of concern to UNHCR including IDP, asylum seekers and refugees in different contexts (urban, DCs, IDP, DP) during Feb2021 with NFIs and HKs.- Regarding the Shelter projects, shelter activities are implemented through NRC in the eastern and western regions.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In the East it is planned shelter rehabilitation for 95 HHs and rehabilitation of infrastructure for 2 IDP camps subject to the authority approval.
