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| <p><u>Updates from Partners</u></p> <p>CEFA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • During October, the first round of distributions completed in Al-Zawiya 130 HK, PPE and Food kits to 130 HH. Migrants refugees and asylum seekers • next round of distributions will also include NFI kits <p>CESVI</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • in coordination with MoSA, NFI’s distribution continue in Misrata targeting non-displaced populations • Door to door distribution of hygiene kits to refugees and migrants and asylum seekers • Distributing NFI’s as a part of their care giver arrangement • 158 individuals benefited from cash for rent in October. The assistance targeted migrants, refugees and non-displaced populations and provided cash for rent for the duration of 4 – 6 months. <p>DRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SDC project for rehabilitation of houses for returnees in Ain Zara | | |



- Assessments completed for 44 HH in Ain Zara- distribution of shelter kits/materials is planned to start in Nov
- IDP populations- assessment completed in Sidi Al Sayeh Site, distribution to start next week
- Ain Zara IDP site – DRC identified the site through Ain Zara Municipality. The ownership of the land was contested and the new owner evicted the site, before the eviction DRC completed the assessment of 12 HH. Only two families will be supported. the site originally had 19 HH
- Sooq Al Ahad IDP site- 60 HH from Tawergha. New site for DRC. DRC completed an assessment there, needs were found to be high and no previous assistance was provided by any other partner
- Migrants – DRC assessed sites in Gergaresh and Soq Al Jumaa and Krimia. Recently DRC did a new round of assessments including landlords and focal points. According to the focal points → populations are moving free and the situation is not scary→ DRC is still planning to do more assessment and possible support access to accommodation there
- NFI distributions to 866 individuals completed during October

NRC

In Partnership with UNHCR

- Two infrastructure projects in Sidi Faraj and Garyounis camps in Benghazi completed.
- Rehabilitation of 30 shelter units in Al Hilles camp, Benghazi completed.
- Rehabilitation and upgrade of 82 sub-standard and damaged houses in Al Sabrie and Benina is ongoing in Benghazi– works expected to be completed end of November.
- Rehabilitation and upgrade of three infrastructure projects in Abu Salim, Tripoli, work is ongoing and expected completion date is mid of November.
- Rehabilitation of three rain water pumping stations in Tripoli is ongoing

Other Projects

- Rehabilitation of two health centers in Al Hadba and Mashroe Zerae- Tripoli completed
- Rehabilitation and upgrade of 55 sub-standard and damaged housing units in Gymmenis and Benina in Benghazi ongoing.
- Rehabilitation of housing units – Tripoli: first batch of 60 houses are completed, contractor’s selection, implementation work has been started, expected completion is end of November
- Rehabilitation and upgrade of 2 infrastructure projects in Tripoli and Benghazi; all technical documents are completed, tender evaluations are finalized and the



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| | <p>implementation works have been started, expected completion date for both is 1st week of December</p> <p>IOM</p> <p>4 different mechanism to provide SNFI assistance presented</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RRM – providing emergency assistance within 72 hours with other UN agencies, NFI’s, Food and dignity kits • Direct assistance- distribution at DC’s and disembarkation points (3,000 people reached with NFI’s during October) • Migrant response mechanism- covering needs in urban settings identified through referrals or outreach campaign (2990 migrants supported through this mechanism during October) • Protection – providing host family arrangements to shelter vulnerable migrants temporarily. IOM provides support to the host family as well. <p>UNHCR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Winterization plan covers IDP’s Refugees in Urban areas, reached 1700 HH in the west, east and south during October • By next week distributions will cover 8 IDP settlements in Benghazi • Planned distributions in Ajilat and AL Zawyah- pending security assessment • Distribution of items in Alzn Zara and Share al zawya and gamfouda DC’s • Provided NFI’s as a response to the floods in the east <p>REACH</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Qualitative assessment focused on shelter including accessing rental markets for refugees and migrants is still ongoing. • Preliminary findings will be presented next meeting. • Joint assessment between the SNFI sector, REACH, NRC looking the pathways to reconstruction. The assessment will look at the ability of IDP, returnee and non-displaced populations to reconstruct their houses and barriers to reconstruction with the objective is how the humanitarian assistance can contribute. Geographical scope- Abu Salim, Tawergha, Benghazi, Derna • Data collection will take place in 2 phases in November and January with plans to conclude the assessment and present final results in March | | |
