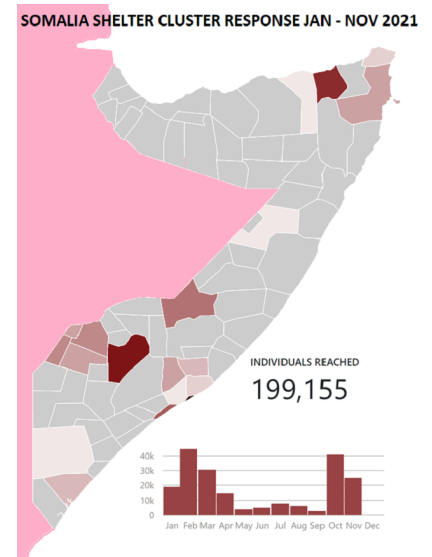

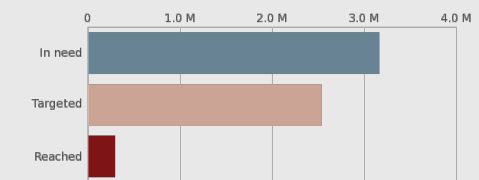
HIGHLIGHTS

According to PRMN report, 42,000 people have been internally displaced in the month of November in various locations in Somalia due to the raging drought

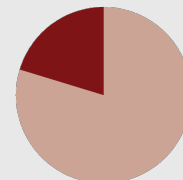

COVERAGE AGAINST TARGETS



NEED ANALYSIS

Around 3.2 million people are in need of Shelter and NFI assistance in Somalia. According to PRMN report, conflict and drought has displaced 777,000 people between January and November 2021. Most of the displaced have arrived in Banadir, Dhuusamarreeb, Baidoa, Beletweyne, Jowhar, Luuq, Doolow, Gaalkacy, Xudur, Cadaado, Saakow, Hobyo, Afgooye and Afmdhow districts. The displaced are in urgent need of shelter and NFI assistance.

RESPONSE

In November 2021, the Cluster Partners reached 24,141 people with non-food items (NFI) kits; and 24,906 people with shelter assistance. Cumulatively in 2021, the Shelter Cluster partners have reached 264,448 individuals (11%) of 2.3 Million targeted with NFI assistance, and 199,155 individuals (9%) of the 2.4 million targeted with shelter assistance.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- There are 7,000 NFI kits and 6,000 shelter kits in stock countrywide. This is not sufficient to respond to the shelter and NFI needs of the newly displaced population as well as the needs of the IDPs living in protracted situation.
- Funding is urgently required to respond to the displacements and to pre-position the NFI and shelter items for potential displacements in near future.

IN SEARCH OF SUSTAINABILITY AND DURABILITY

In May 2021, The Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) received funds from SHF to construct 50 Transitional shelters at Awal Barwaqo and Keerow Margan-2 IDP camps. This was a community driven prototype featuring local designs, techniques and materials. To come up with the designs of the shelter typologies, NRC successfully conducted two rounds of consultative meetings with local communities, authorities and shelter cluster partners to brainstorm. Five different Shelter prototypes were selected by the community to be piloted.



Corrugated iron sheet gauge 34- Room with verandah.



Hybrid shelter/room 4mx4m- (Block walls up to 40cm high and the rest of CGI sheets) with verandah.



CGI shelter (5mx4.2m) with internal plywood walls. one room.



"Barako 5mx4m" type shelter with verandah made up of natural wooden stick walls plastered with mix of mud and cow dung.



► "Barako 5mx4m" type shelter made up of natural wooden stick walls with stone plinth protection and CGI roofing and verandah. The shelter is plastered with cement/sand mortar on the outside.

In the end, the community preferred to replicate the prototype **1** (because of ease of construction and durability), and prototype **4** (because it is made from local technique and materials).

Each HH received USD1,000 in three installments: the first installment was 50% and was received in advance before construction to purchase materials and to start construction works; the second installment was 30% and was received after procurement and delivery of materials to site and completing the construction of walls; the final 20% was paid upon completion of shelter.
