Billy Beynon! Our school had some great nicknames for teachers, but this wasn't one we used to make fun. For that there was Bongo Harry, Herman Thomas, Commander Jones, Cruncher Castle, Tadpole Bailey and Creeping Jesus. Bongo Harry later became Boxing Bongo Harry after he clouted a kid. Creeping Jesus became Creeping Willy for... well, he just disappeared one day. His new name had only lasted a short while after he was seen exposing himself to a boy in our class under his desk. Calling Mr Beynon by his first name may suggest we didn't much care for him, but like other respected teachers such as Tom Martindale and Ken Wilby, it showed the great respect we had for him.

He was also my introduction to Wales.

Billy Beynon came from Swansea and taught me English so well that I went from scoring the lowest mark in the end-of-year English exam in the whole fourth form to being awarded a Grade 1 at O-Level a year later. He encouraged us to write, to experiment with blank verse, to think, to take a chance and risk being wrong; all transferable skills which have been so useful to me since. We learnt to listen and think as he read Dylan Thomas poems to us in his beautiful lilting Welsh accent (try to say that as they do in Swansea - bew-ti-full). He was an inspiration.


Billy had left our school by the time I turned seventeen when our family moved to Swansea, so I couldn't tell him we were to live a corner-turn and a hundred steps from the gates of Cwmdonkin Park, often mentioned in Thomas' poems about

his childhood. I walked through every day, up the many, many steps to the college from which I left a trained teacher. On the way home I could look out over Swansea Bay, to the terraced houses by the city centre, to the dirt of industry away to the east. Always to the east in any industrial town I was told, so the prevailing wind didn't blow the smoke over the bosses' houses. I could see the hills of the Gower peninsular away to my right and the Vetch Field off to my left.


From that view I came to bond with Wales in a way only an outsider, a Sais, can manage. When taking the images in this book, I photographed the amazing grandstands that so many clubs built and also the many home-made structures, each evidencing the industrial skills of those involved with the clubs. Once inside, I tried to look back outside the ground, to appreciate the settings in which they are set, and to see the houses where club members, players, spectators or their families might live. Each image has been carefully cropped to draw the eye into and around the key features.

I could add captions, I could add detail to the images, but I prefer to let you appreciate them with minimal interference, just club names and the year in which I visited the ground. I hope those with the book get as much pleasure from looking at the images as I have from putting it together.


Odd though, only when I was staring at the blank screen earlier looking for a way to start this introduction did I make the connection and realise how much I had gained from being taught by Billy Beynon.
