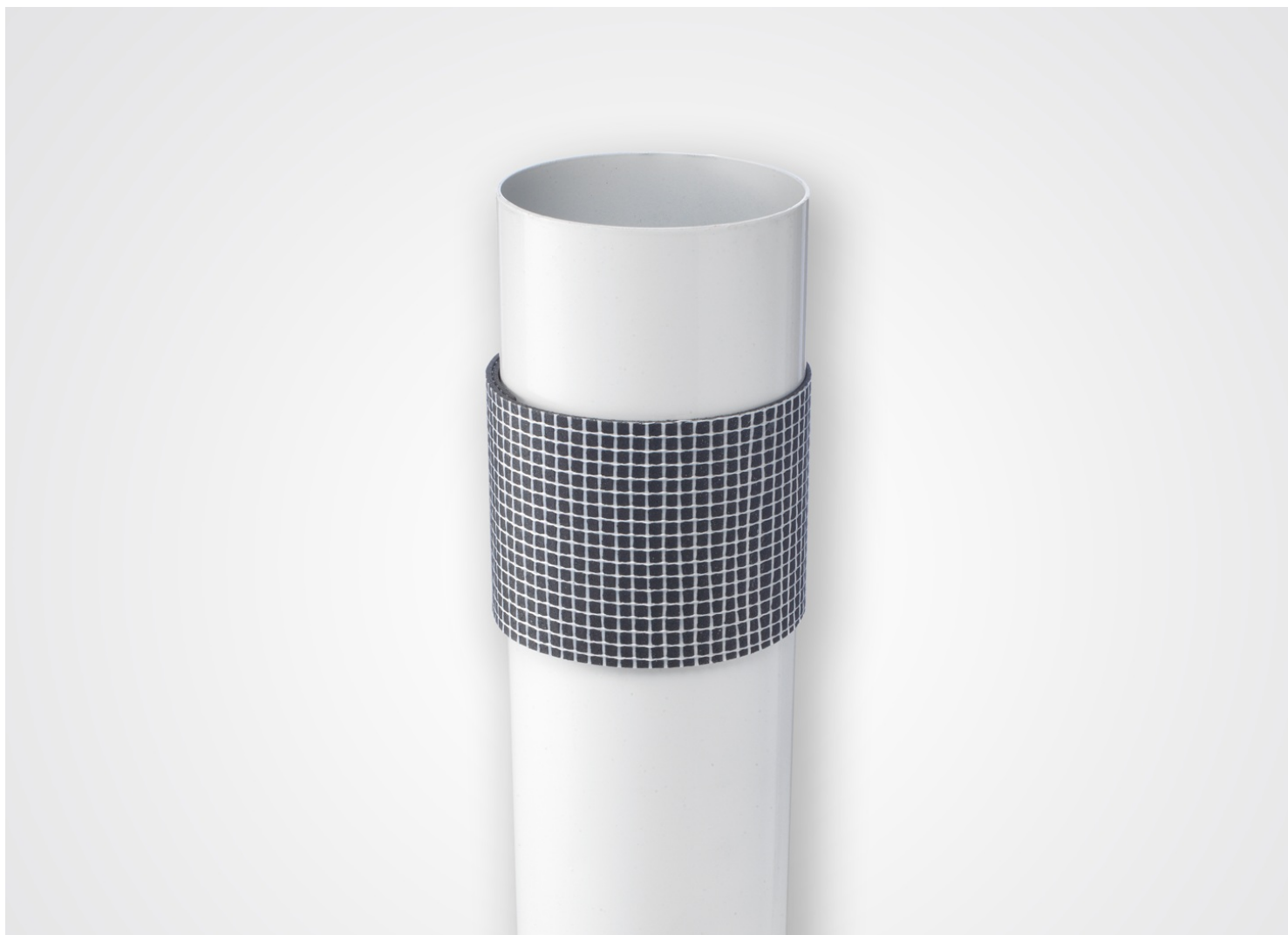

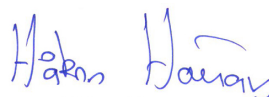

Product

Product description:

Protecta FR Pipe Wrap is designed to maintain the fire resistance of fire separating walls and floors when these are breached by plastic pipes, conduits or metal pipes with continuous combustible insulation. It may be used in drywalls, masonry or concrete walls and floors.

Each pipe wrap consists of a graphite-based reactive intumescent strip which reacts to heat and closes the opening left by the softening plastic pipe or pipe insulation in a fire. It can be installed completely around the pipes or insulation and secured with the self adhesive tab. The annular space around the pipe wrap is to be sealed with EX Mortar or FR Board.

Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on EPDs according to EN 15804 and different LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.

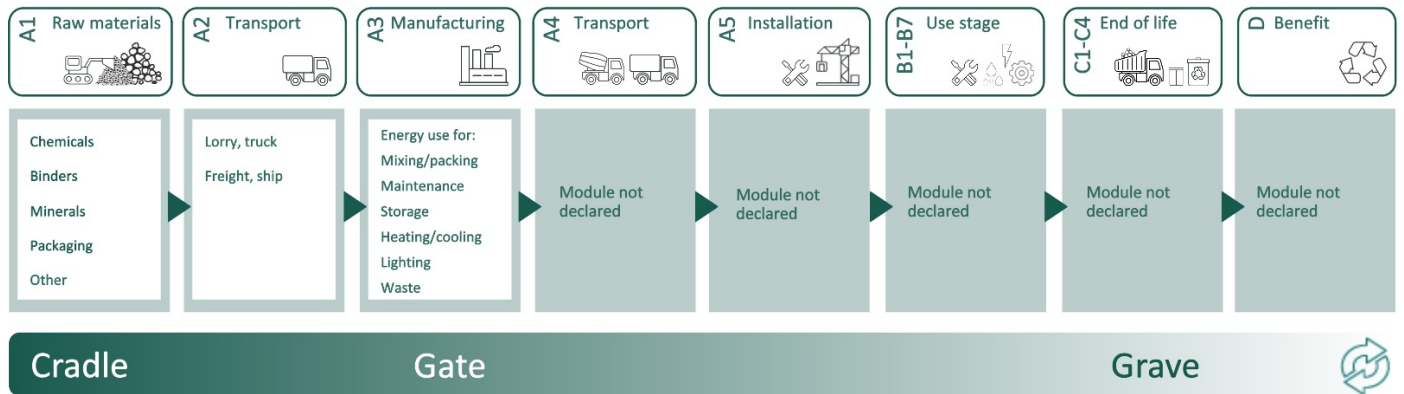

System boundary:

The life cycle analysis is a cradle-to-gate (A1 - A3) study. It includes the extraction and production of raw materials and packaging, transportation to the manufacturing site, as well as the manufacturing process itself.

A1: Wooden pallets and plastic wrapping are excluded because the product is shipped in boxes.
