Escape to the Country with The Royal Ballet's La Fille mal gardée, in cinemas 5th November

Frederick Ashton's charming classic *La Fille mal gardée* returns to The Royal Ballet with a live cinema relay this autumn. Brimming with humour and choreographic invention, *La Fille mal gardée* is the perfect ballet for all the family. Royal Ballet Principal dancers Francesca Hayward and Marcelino Sambè perform the lead roles as Lise and Colas respectively for the live Cinema relay on 5 November with encore screenings from Sunday 9 November 2025.

La Fille mal gardée premiered in Covent Garden on 28 January 1960 and instantly become a popular staple of The Royal Ballet repertoire. Inspired by **Jean Dauberval**'s French ballet, Ashton's version captures the essence of the English countryside, with comic capers, exuberant energy and a love story to melt your heart. Lise, the only daughter of Widow Simone, is in love with the young farmer Colas, but her mother has far more ambitious plans for her.

Prepare to be whisked away to pastoral bliss with Ashton's affectionate portrayal of village life, his virtuosic choreography combining with **Ferdinand Hérold**'s score and **Osbert Lancaster** designs to create a ballet of pure perfection.
