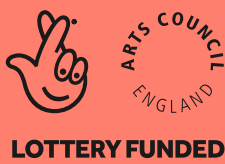

Le Gateau Chocolat. This joyful reimagining of Hans Christian Andersen’s The Ugly Duckling shares messages of self-acceptance and kindness.

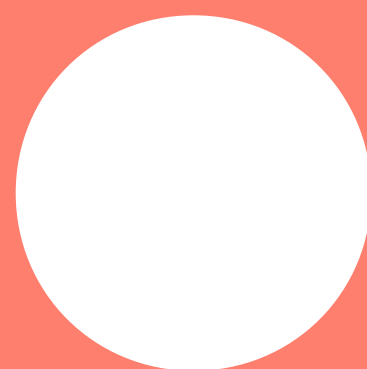
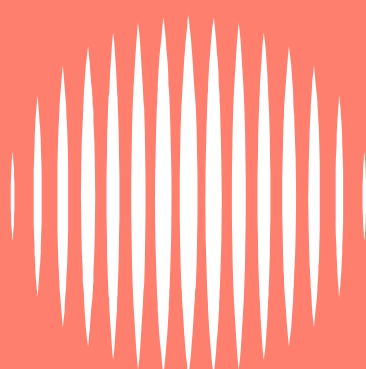

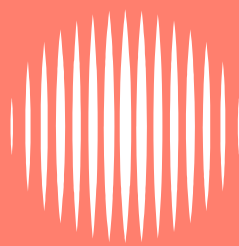
A Letter from Ben

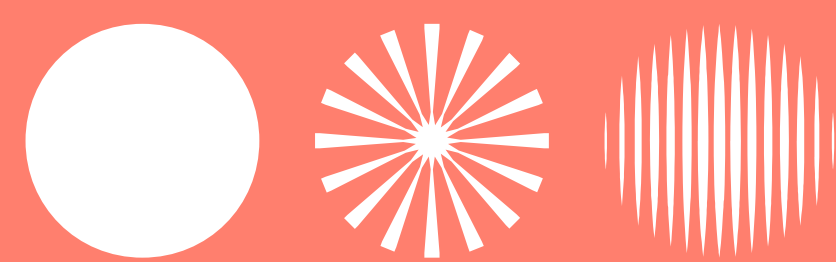

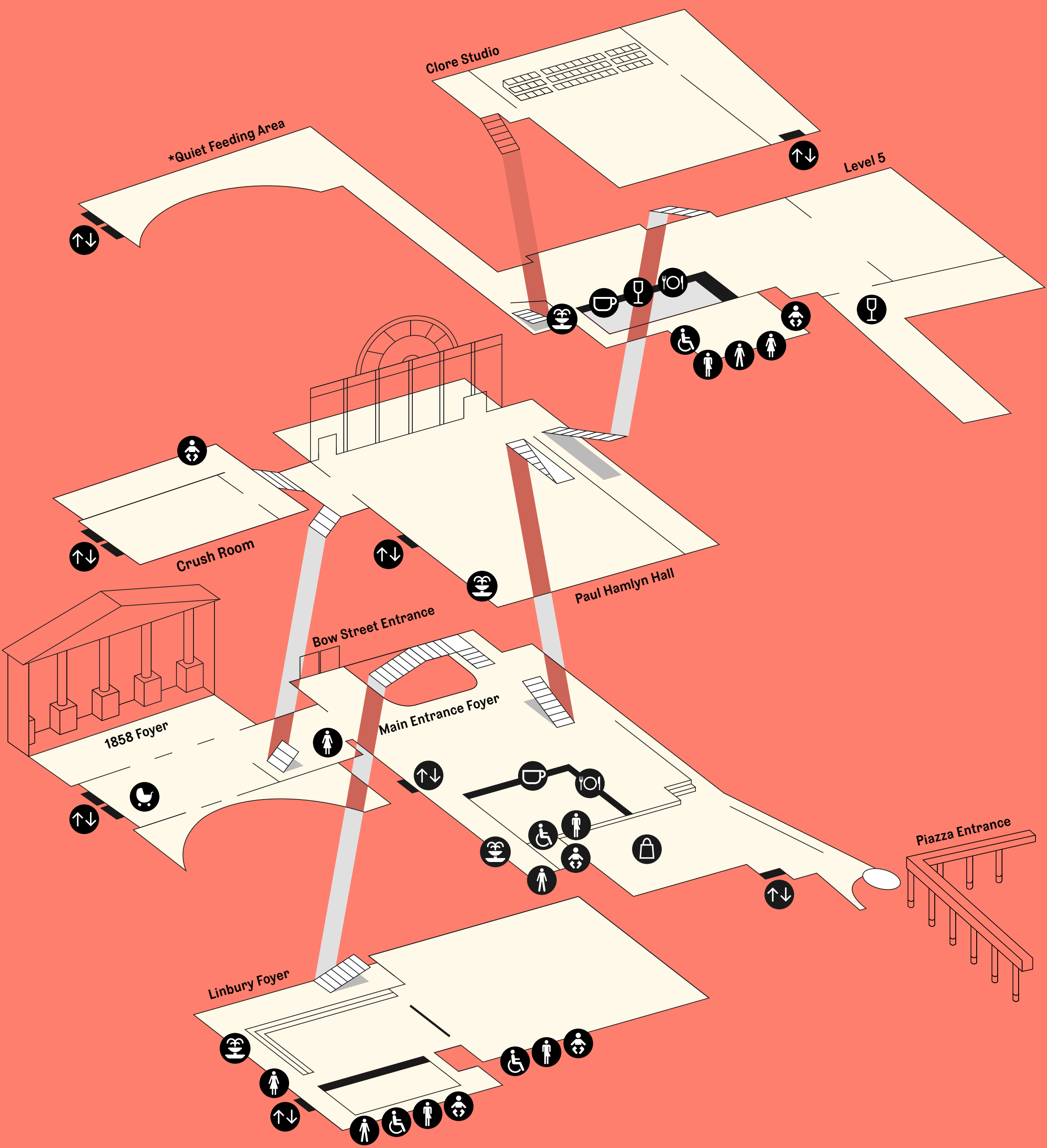
