FAITH PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Faith is a lined fur coat, cocoon-shaped and loose-fitting. The front bust darts have been moved to the shoulder seam. The coat features a notched turn-down collar with a collar stand. There are welt pockets on the front below the waistline. Faith has an extended shoulder line and long, set-in, two-piece sleeves. The coat closes with an off-center front snap closure. Faith is below mid-calf length.

SEAM ALLOWANCES


Pattern pieces include the following seam allowances:

- garment hem - 4cm (1 5/8")
- sleeve hem - 4cm (1 5/8")
- welt side seams - 1.5cm (5/8")
- all other edges - 1cm (3/8")


Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.

CUTTING LAYOUT

Main fabric, 145cm (57") wide, cut on fold, for sizes XS-S
in all heights, for a directional print and nap



Main fabric, 145cm (57") wide, cut on fold, for sizes M-L
in all heights, for a directional print and nap



Attention! The collar stand pieces are cut on a single layer out of leftover material.



We recommend testing your interfacing and/or fusible tape on a scrap of fabric before applying it to the pattern pieces. Check your iron's temperature and steam settings (check if it's safe to use steam on your main fabric). Check how long it takes for the interfacing to bond. Important! When working with fur, make sure its appearance is not affected.

Fully interface the following pieces:

- upper collar - 1 piece on fold
- undercollar - 2 pieces
- collar stand - 2 pieces
- welt - 2 pieces
- front facing - 2 pieces

To apply the interfacing, position its glue side onto the wrong side of the fabric piece (or part of it) and press. Do not move the iron back and forth. Firmly press the piece section by section, holding it down with the iron for a few seconds until that section is adhered and then pressing down the next section. You can use a cotton pressing cloth to protect your iron. Once the interfacing is fused, leave the piece on a hard flat surface for 15 minutes for it to cool down.
