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PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Shelly is a loose-fitting single-breasted coat with a straight cut. It features a detachable hood and front patch pockets with pointed flaps that fasten with a button and buttonhole. The back features a yoke with a decorative button tab at the center. The coat has a drop shoulder and long, shirt-style, two-piece sleeves embellished with a tab at the hem, which fastens with a button and buttonhole. There are inseam pockets in the side seams and short slits at the hem. The coat has a turn-down collar with a collar stand and a center front button closure. The coat hem is curved and is longer at the back. Decorative topstitching accentuates the pocket flaps, sleeve tabs, back yoke tab, collar, yoke, inseam pocket openings, front edge, as well as garment hem and slits. The coat is fully lined and is below-hip length.

When the main pieces of a garment are fully interfaced, we recommend cutting the main pieces with additional 1 cm (3/8") seam allowances on all sides. This way, if the fabric shrinks after being interfaced, there will still be enough fabric.

Before applying interfacing to the main fabric, we recommend testing interfacing and/or straight fusible tape on a leftover piece of fabric. Also, make sure to check the settings on your iron: the temperature, the steam (if the main fabric can be interfaced using the steam setting), and the time needed for the interfacing to adhere to the main fabric.

To interface, put the wrong side of the fabric piece to the gluey side of the interfacing (the side that feels rough to the touch) and press with the iron.

Do not iron the piece, but instead press it section by section, holding it down with the iron a few seconds until that section is adhered and then pressing down the next section. You may use a cotton pressing cloth to protect your iron sole. Once the interfacing process is complete, leave the piece on a hard, flat surface for 15 minutes for it to cool down.



Place the top and bottom pocket flap pieces right sides together. Align all the edges and corners.

Pin, baste, slightly easing the top flap in and machine-stitch. Backstitch in the beginning and end.

Press the seam flat.

Trim the seam allowance down to 3 mm (1/8") on the bottom flap. Trim the corners down to 2 mm.
