DIANA PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Diana is a semi-fitted dress with an accentuated waist and a skirt that flares out towards the bottom. The dress is fitted with front and back princess seams. The back has shoulder darts transferred to the neckline. The front features pockets at the sides. The dress has a round neckline and voluminous, elbow-length, set-in sleeves. The sleeves feature pleats at the caps and darts at the hems. The hems of the sleeves are finished with facings. The dress is finished with a free-hanging lining and fastens with an invisible zipper in the center back seam. Diana is midi length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this dress, choose dress-weight and suiting fabrics with the following properties:

- · medium weight, structured, breathable, low-stretch or non-stretch, with good drape
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (wool, silk, cotton, linen), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (wool + silk, wool + polyester, cotton + viscose, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane)
 - the following fabrics are recommended: dress-weight wool, dress-weight denim, jacquard fabrics

Attention! We do not recommend stretchy knit fabrics and lightweight sheer fabrics (chiffon, organza, stretch lace).

For the lining, we recommend artificial fibers (viscose), blends (viscose + elastane, viscose + polyester), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane).

The dress in the photo is made of dress-weight wool. The fabric is medium weight, with good drape and very little stretch. The fiber content is a blend of wool, viscose, and elastane.

The lining is 97% viscose + 3% elastane.

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front cut 2
- top side front cut 2
- · bottom side front cut 2
- · back cut 2
- · side back cut 2
- · sleeve cut 2
- front neck facing cut 1 on fold
- back neck facing cut 2
- sleeve hem facing cut 2

4. From interfacing:

- front neck facing cut 1 on fold
- back neck facing cut 2
- sleeve hem facing cut 2

The interfacing pieces should be cut on the straight grain.

2. From lining fabric:

- front lining cut 2
- back lining cut 2
- side front lining cut 2
- side back lining cut 2
- pocket lining cut 2

3. From net fabric:

· sleeve head — cut 2

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

Additionally, cut the following pieces from interfacing:

- \cdot two strips, 2 cm (3/4") wide and as long as the interfaced area, to interface the zipper seam allowances. The interfacing strips should be cut on the cross grain (perpendicular to the selvedge)
- two strips, 5 cm (2") wide and as long as the interfaced area, to interface the grown-on pocket facing on the bottom side front piece

SEAM ALLOWANCES

All pattern pieces include seam allowances as follows:

- garment and lining hem allowances 2 cm (3/4")
- zipper seam allowance 1.5 cm (5/8")
- · all other edges 1 cm (3/8")

Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.



Press and steam the darts. Press the dart seam allowances towards the center back. Shrink out the fullness at the dart point.



Overlock the center edges on the front and back pieces.



Press the seams.
