PEYTON PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Peyton is a loose-fitting, straight-cut, lined trench coat. The sample trench coat is made of two types of fabric: faux leather and cotton gabardine, but the garment can also be made of one fabric. The bust darts are transferred to the neckline. The front of the coat features welt pockets and a lined storm flap on the left side. The back has a lined yoke shaped with neck darts. There is a vent in the center back seam. The coat has an extended shoulder line and long, loose-fitting, one-piece, shirt sleeves. At the bottom of the sleeve, there is a detachable button tab threaded through loops. The epaulets at the shoulder seams are folded in half, threaded through loops, and secured with buttons. The collar has a separate collar stand that continues into a strap closed with a button. There is a detachable button tab on the collar. Two half belts are sewn into the side seams and joined with buttons at the back. The trench coat closes with buttons and buttonholes at the center front. Peyton is above-ankle length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this trench coat, choose suiting fabrics with the following properties:

- · medium-weight, pliable, structured, non-stretch or low-stretch
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (cotton), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (cotton + polyester, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + polyurethane)
 - the following fabrics are recommended: cotton gabardine, corduroy, faux leather, faux suede.

Attention! We do not recommend soft, lightweight (raincoat) fabrics.

For the lining, choose lining fabrics made of artificial fibers (viscose), blends (viscose + elastane, viscose + polyester), or synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane).

The trench coat in the photos is made of faux leather and gabardine. The fabric is medium-weight, pliable, structured, low-stretch.

The fiber content is cotton + polyester (gabardine) and polyester + polyurethane (faux leather). The lining is 100% viscose.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- sewing machine for construction
- · buttonhole foot for the sewing machine
- edgestitch foot for the sewing machine (optional)
- · teflon or walking foot for the sewing machine.

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front cut 2
- back cut 2
- sleeve* cut 2
- · collar cut 2
- · collar stand* cut 2
- back yoke* cut 1 on fold
- storm flap* cut 1
- belt* cut 4
- epaulet* cut 4
- · loops* cut 1 (makes 6 pieces)
- · sleeve tab* cut 4
- · collar tab* cut 2
- back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- welt cut 4
- pocket facing cut 2
- front facing cut 2.

Attention! If the garment is made of two types of fabric, the pieces marked with * are cut from faux leather. Also from faux leather, cut two strips, 3 cm by 6 cm (1 1/8" by 2 3/8"), that will be used to finish the dart point on the back yoke.

2. From lining fabric:

- front lining cut 2
- back lining cut 2
- sleeve lining cut 2
- · back yoke lining cut 1 on fold
- storm flap lining cut 1
- pocket top lining cut 2
- pocket bottom lining cut 2.

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.



Press the front darts toward the center front, press the back darts toward the shoulder seam.



Press and steam the darts, shrink out the fullness at the dart points on a tailor's ham.



Place the welt pieces right sides together two by two, align the edges, pin along three sides.
