# JOY PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Joy is a loose-fitting, padded, straight-cut parka featuring yokes both on the front and back. There is a zippered welt chest pocket on the left front. At the hipline, there are shaped welt slash pockets on both front pieces. The casing sewn on along the waistline has a cord with stoppers threaded through it. The garment features an extended shoulder line and shirt sleeves with a relaxed fit. There is a patch pocket with a shaped flap on the right sleeve. The sleeves are finished with elasticated cuffs. A tall stand collar is completed with a detachable hood attached to the garment with a hidden zipper. The hood has a hook-and-loop (Velcro) fastener at the front. The parka closes with a zipper and snaps set on the inner side of the applied center front placket. Joy is fully lined and knee-length.

### SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this parka, choose outerwear fabrics with the following properties:

- · heavyweight, pliable, smooth, non-stretch or low-stretch
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (cotton), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (cotton + polyester, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane)
  - the following fabrics are recommended: outerwear fabrics, gabardine, denim, corduroy.

**Attention!** We do not recommend stretchy jersey fabrics, loop-textured fabrics, and thick, bulky fabrics (coating).

For the lining, choose lining fabrics made of artificial fibers (viscose), blends (viscose + elastane, viscose + polyester), or synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane).

The parka in the photo is made of outerwear fabric. This fabric is heavyweight, structured, non-stretch. The fiber content is 100% polyester.

The lining's fiber content is a blend of viscose and polyester.

Alpolux 100 g/m2 was used as the insulation material.

### PATTERN PIECES LIST

#### 1. From main fabric:

- right front cut 1
- · left front cut 1
- right front yoke cut 1
- · left front yoke cut 1
- · chest pocket facing cut 1
- · chest pocket welt cut 1
- outer placket cut 1
- inner placket cut 1
- top welt cut 2
- · bottom welt cut 2
- pocket facing cut 2
- back cut 1 on fold
- back yoke cut 1 on fold
- · sleeve cut 2
- patch pocket cut 1
- patch pocket flap cut 2
- · cuff cut 2
- right front casing cut 1
- left front casing cut 1
- back casing cut 1 on fold
- right front facing cut 1
- left front facing cut 1
- · back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- back neck placket cut 2
- · collar stand cut 2
- outer hood side panel cut 2
- outer hood center panel cut 1
- inner hood side panel cut 2
- inner hood center panel cut 1.

#### 2. From insulation (Alpolux 100 g/m2)

- \*right front + right front yoke cut 1
- \*left front + left front yoke cut 1
- \*back + back yoke cut 1 on fold
- · sleeve cut 2
- · collar stand cut 1
- · outer hood side panel cut 2
- · outer hood center panel cut 1
- outer placket cut 1 (1/2 the width).
- \* Cut these two pieces as a single piece, aligning them along the seamline. After stitching the insulation pieces to the assembled shell garment pieces, true the insulation pieces to the outer shell.

*IMPORTANT!* Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

#### 3. From lining fabric:

- front lining cut 2
- · back lining cut 2
- · sleeve lining cut 2
- · chest pocket top lining cut 1
- · chest pocket bottom lining cut 1
- pocket top lining cut 2
- pocket bottom lining cut 2.

#### 4. From interfacing:

- · collar stand cut 1
- back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- right front facing cut 1
- left front facing cut 1
- top welt cut 2
- patch pocket flap cut 1
- · chest pocket welt cut 1.

Additionally, cut the following pieces from interfacing:

- two 5 cm (2") wide strips to interface pocket opening areas on the right front and left front pieces
- one 4 cm (1 5/8") wide strip to interface the chest pocket opening area on the left front piece
- one 3 cm (1 1/8") wide strip to interface the patch pocket flap stitching and patch pocket top edge areas on the right sleeve piece
- one strip to interface the grown-on facing area on the patch pocket
- twelve 2×2 cm (3/4×3/4") square pieces to interface snap and grommet placement on the left front, left front yoke, outer placket, outer hood side panel, right front casing, and left front casing pieces.


The interfacing strips should be cut on the straight grain (parallel to the selvedge).



Place the back yoke and back pieces right sides together.

Place the front yoke and front pieces right sides together.

Align the edges, match the notches, pin, and machine-stitch, backstitching at the beginning and end.



Press the seams flat.



Press the seam allowances open.
