## MANUELA PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Manuela is a semi-fitted dress with an accentuated waist. The dress has a waist seam and shaped bands along the front neckline which are joined together with a hook-and-eye fastener. The wrap skirt features curved edges at the front. There are inverted box pleats on the front and back bodice, as well as on the front and back skirt. The dress has long, flared raglan sleeves. There is a pleat at the bottom of the front sleeve secured with a line of stitching. The dress fastens with sew-on snaps at the waist seam, as well as with a narrow tie belt. Manuela is below mid-calf length.

## **SUGGESTED FABRIC**

To sew this dress, choose dress-weight fabrics with the following properties:

- · medium-weight, pliable, soft, non-stretch or low-stretch, opaque
- the fabric content can include natural (silk, cotton, linen), artificial (viscose), blends (cotton + silk, silk + viscose, etc.), and synthetic fibers (polyester, polyester + elastane)
- the following fabrics are recommended: dress-weight satin, crepe, man-made silk, cupro, silk velvet.

**Attention!** We do not recommend very stretchy knit materials (jersey fabric) and lightweight sheer fabrics (chiffon, stretch lace).

The dress in the photo is made in man-made silk. This fabric is medium-weight, pliable, soft, and has little stretch. The fiber content is 100% polyester.

# TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- sewing machine for construction
- overlocker for finishing raw edges. It may be replaced with a stretch overlock stitch or a zigzag stitch on the sewing machine (overlock or zigzag stitch width 2-3 mm, stitch length 2.5 mm)
- · edge stitching foot for the sewing machine (optional).

### PATTERN PIECES LIST

#### 1. From main fabric:

- front bodice cut 2
- front band cut 4
- right front skirt cut 1
- · left front skirt cut 1
- · back bodice cut 1 on fold
- · back skirt cut 1 on fold
- front sleeve cut 2
- back sleeve cut 2
- back neck facing cut 1
- front bodice binding cut 2
- · waist seam binding (1st part) cut 1
- waist seam binding (2nd part) cut 1
- · waist seam binding (3rd part) cut 1
- belt cut 1.

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

#### 2. From interfacing:

- front band cut 4
- back neck facing cut 1.

### **SEAM ALLOWANCES**

#### All pattern pieces include seam allowances as follows:

- · sleeve hem allowance 8 cm (3 1/8")
- all other seams 1 cm (3/8").

Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.



Press the front band pieces flat, while forming a 1–2 mm roll on the right side.

As a result, the bottom side of the front band is peeking out by 1–2 mm from underneath the upper side. True the bottom side to the upper side.



Form the pleats on the front and back bodice pieces following the markings on the pattern pieces. Pin the pleats in place. Work two parallel rows of stitching at the bottom edge of the bodice pieces. One row should be at 5 mm (just under 1/4") from the edge, and the second – at 7 mm (just over 1/4"). These stitching lines stabilize the bottom edge and secure the pleats in place at the same time.

Stay stitch along the neckline and armscye edges on the front bodice at 7 mm (just over 1/4") from the edge.

**Important!** After stay stitching, verify the edges against the pattern pieces and adjust the length if necessary.



Form the pleats on the front and back skirt pieces following the markings on the pattern pieces. Pin the pleats in place. Work two parallel rows of stitching at the upper edge of the skirt pieces. One row should be at 5 mm (just under 1/4") from the edge, and the second – at 7 mm (just over 1/4"). These stitching lines stabilize the upper edge and secure the pleats in place at the same time.
