

NURIT PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Nurit is a straight, loose-fitting coat, slightly tapered at the bottom, featuring wide horizontal quilting. The coat has front and back princess seams and front inseam pockets. The drop-shoulder sleeves are long and wide. The high standing collar is detachable and is attached with snaps. The coat closes with set-in snaps. Nurit is below-knee length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this coat, choose outerwear fabrics with the following properties:

- · medium-weight, soft, without stretch, opaque, wind- and water-resistant
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (cotton), artificial fibers (viscose, acetate), blends (cotton + polyester, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane)
 - the following fabrics are recommended: blended raincoat fabrics, dewspo, twill, taffeta, taslan, etc.

For the lining, choose lining fabrics made from artificial fibers (viscose), blends (viscose + elastane, viscose + polyester), or synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane).

For the insulation layer, use alpolux, isosoft, thinsulate, polyester batting 100 g/m2 + swan down.

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front cut 2
- side front cut 2
- · back cut 1 on fold
- side back cut 2
- sleeve cut 2
- stand cut 2
- · back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- front facing cut 2
- placket cut 1 on fold

2. From lining:

- front lining cut 2
- back lining cut 1 on fold
- sleeve lining cut 2
- pocket bag cut 4

3. From spunbond:

- front cut 2
- side front cut 2
- · back cut 1 on fold
- side back cut 2
- sleeve cut 2
- stand cut 1

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all the notches from the pattern to your fabric.

4. From alpolux 100 insulation:

- · back lining cut 1 on fold
- front lining cut 2
- · sleeve lining cut 2
- · back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- front facing cut 2
- placket cut 1 (1/2 width)
- stand cut 1

5. From interfacing:


- front facing cut 2
- · back neck facing cut 1 on fold

Partially interface the following:

- back 1 piece. Interface the neckline edge with stitch-reinforced fusible bias tape. Interface the shoulder edges with straight grain stay tape. Interface the snap placement with 2x2cm (3/4x3/4") squares of interfacing.
- front 2 pieces. Interface the neckline edge with stitch-reinforced fusible bias tape. Interface the pocket opening with the grown-on pocket facing so that the interfacing covers the front piece by 1cm (3/8"). Interface the snap placement with 2x2cm (3/4x3/4") squares of interfacing.
- stand 1 piece. Interface the side and lower edges with strips of interfacing.
- placket 1 piece. Interface one half along the long edge.







Using chalk, mark the stitching lines on the right side of the fabric of the following pieces:

- Back
- Side back
- Front
- Side front
- Stand
- Sleeve

Pin the corresponding spunbond pieces to the wrong side of the garment pieces.

Machine stitch over the lines through both layers. Stitch additional lines on the right side of the fabric as shown in the photos, 5mm (1/4 in) away from the edge. This will form the cavities - "pockets" - to be filled with the swan down.

- On the sleeve pieces stitch along the sleeve heads, leaving an 8cm (3 in) opening at the center of the curve
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ On the upper collar piece along the side and bottom edges
- On the front and back pieces along the shoulder and neckline edges
- On the side front and side back pieces along the shoulder edge, then along the neckline and the sides
