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EDWIGE

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PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Edwige is a loose fitting blouse with a straight silhouette, sewn in a lightweight fabric. The front features yokes and a soft gathering in the top portion, a slightly dropped shoulder which gives a soft line in the shoulder slope, and a deep V-shaped neckline. The blouse is collarless. It fastens with button loops and buttons, with part of the button loops going up to the yoke serving only a decorative function. Edwige features a long set-in bishop sleeve, with a soft gathering ending in a tall cuff. The cuff also fastens with button loops and buttons. Edwige is below-the-hip length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this blouse, choose woven fabrics with the following properties:

- Light to medium weight, non-stretch or with very little stretch, soft, fluid
- The fiber content can include natural fibers (silk), artificial (viscose), blends (silk + polyester, etc), and synthetic (polyester, polyester + elastane, etc)
- The following fabrics are recommended: natural and artificial silk, dress-weight viscose, crepe, thin atlas, chiffon

The blouse on the photo is made with a thin, soft, non-stretch material. The fiber content is 30% silk and 70% viscose.

2. Woven fusible interfacing, 140cm wide, in meters

IMPORTANT!

When purchasing fabric, please account for shrinkage and buy 5% more than required.

- 3. 16 covered buttons, 8mm in diameter
- 4. Matching thread 1 spool
- 5. One pair of 14cm wide shoulder pads

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- Sewing machine for construction
- Stitch-in-the-ditch foot for your sewing machine (optional)
- · Loop turner
- Tool for making covered buttons

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- Right front cut 1
- Left front cut 1
- Back cut 1
- Front yoke cut 4
- Right front facing cut 1
- Left front facing cut 1
- Back neck facing cut 1
- Sleeve cut 2
- Cuff cut 4
- Rouleau button loops cut 2

2. From interfacing:

- Front yoke cut 4
- Right front facing cut 1
- Left front facing cut 1
- Back neck facing cut 1
- Cuff cut 4

IMPORTANT!

Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

Additionally, apply bias cut and stitched tape interfacing to the following:

- Neckline edges on both front yokes
- Neckline edge on the back neck facing
- Neckline and front edges on the right and left front facings
- Cuff edges on both pieces



Press the seam allowances towards the interfacing side.



Turn the front facings' interfacing to the facings' wrong sides and fuse the interfacing by pressing with an iron. As you're pressing, form a 1mm roll towards the interfaced side.



Turn the back neck facing's interfacing to the facing's wrong side and fuse the interfacing by pressing with an iron. As you're pressing, form a 1mm roll towards the interfaced side.
