

# AVA PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Ava is a pair of low-rise briefs with side seams. The gusset is lined with cotton jersey. All edges of the briefs are finished with picot-edge lingerie elastic.

## SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew these briefs, choose knit fabrics with the following properties: • soft, stretchy (1.2–1.5 stretch factor), medium-weight. The following fabrics are recommended: microfiber, jersey knits, stretch mesh.

You can determine the stretch factor of the fabric yourself. Mark 10 cm (4") along the crosswise grain of the fabric, lay a ruler next to the marked section, and stretch the fabric. Divide the measurement you get by 10.

The briefs in the photo are made of jersey. The fabric is medium weight, soft, and stretchy. The fiber content is 92% cotton and 8% spandex. The fabric weight is 180 g/m<sup>2</sup>. The additional material is 100% cotton. The fabric weight is 120 g/m<sup>2</sup>.

*IMPORTANT!* When purchasing fabric and elastic, please account for shrinkage and buy 5% more than required.

4. Matching thread — 5 spools (1 spool for the sewing machine + 4 spools for the overlocker)

# TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

sewing machine for construction

• overlocker for construction and finishing raw edges. It can be replaced with a stretch overlock stitch or a zigzag stitch on the sewing machine (overlock or zigzag stitch width 2–3 mm, stitch length 2.5 mm)

*IMPORTANT!* We recommend using specialty needles when working with knit fabrics and elastic (for example, STRETCH, SUPER STRETCH, JERSEY, etc.). When sewing, a ball-shaped needle point pushes the knit loops apart without piercing the threads.

# PATTERN PIECES LIST

From main fabric:
 front — cut 1 on fold
 back — cut 1 on fold

*IMPORTANT!* Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

2. From additional fabric: • gusset — cut 1

# SEAM ALLOWANCES

All pattern pieces include seam allowances as follows:
all edges — 1 cm (3/8").
Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.



Place the gusset right side down onto the wrong side of the back piece, align the bottom edges.

Place the front and back pieces right sides together, align the bottom edges. Match the notches and pin.

Stitch on the overlocker, with the front piece facing up. Press the seam flat.

Use a 4-thread overlocker for this step. You can replace the overlocker with a stretch or zigzag stitch on your sewing machine.

**Important!** All pattern pieces include 1 cm (3/8") seam allowances. The overlocker stitch width is narrower than the seam allowance. You can either trim the seam allowances beforehand or let the overlocker cut off the extra fabric while stitching.

Fold the gusset towards the front piece and press it along the seam.
