FLEUR PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Fleur is a close-fitting, fully lined blazer. The front is shaped with bust darts and princess seams. The back has a center seam and princess seams. The blazer has a deep, open-shoulder neckline and a double-breasted button and buttonhole closure. The grown-on sleeves are made up of two pieces and short. Fleur is hip-length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this blazer, choose suiting fabrics with the following properties:

- · medium weight, structured, opaque, non-stretch or with very little stretch
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (wool, cotton), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (wool + silk, wool + polyester, cotton + viscose, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane)
 - the following fabrics are recommended: suiting, wool suiting, gabardine

Attention! We do not recommend stretchy fabrics (knits), lightweight soft fabrics, or loosely woven fabrics.

For the lining, choose lining fabrics made of artificial fibers (viscose), blends (viscose + elastane, viscose + polyester), or synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane).

The blazer in the photo is made of suiting fabric. The fabric is medium weight, soft, and non-stretch. The fiber content is 100% wool. The fabric weight is 320 g/m^2 .

The lining is a blend of 55% viscose and 45% polyester. The lining fabric weight is 100 g/m².

- 4. Stitched bias-cut fusible stay tape with stitch reinforcement, 1.5 cm (5/8") wide 2.4–3 m (2 5/8–3 1/4 yd), depending on the chosen size and height
- 5. One button, 1.2–1.5 cm (1/2–5/8") in diameter
- 6. Six buttons, 2.2-2.5 cm (7/8-1") in diameter
- 7. Matching thread for the main fabric 1 spool for the sewing machine
- 8. Matching thread for the lining fabric 1 spool for the sewing machine

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- sewing machine for construction
- buttonhole foot for the sewing machine
- stitch-in-the-ditch foot for the sewing machine (optional)

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front cut 2
- · back cut 2
- · side front cut 2
- · side back cut 2
- · bottom sleeve cut 2
- back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- front facing cut 2

2. From lining fabric:

- front lining cut 2
- back lining cut 1 on fold
- front sleeve lining cut 2
- back sleeve lining cut 2

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

3. From interfacing:

- front cut 2
- back cut 2
- · side front cut 2
- · side back cut 2
- · bottom sleeve cut 2
- · back neck facing cut 1 on fold
- front facing cut 2

SEAM ALLOWANCES


All pattern pieces include seam allowances as follows:

- garment hem allowance 3 cm (1 1/8")
- sleeve hem allowance 3 cm (1 1/8")
- all other edges 1 cm (3/8")


Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.


Main fabric, 140 cm (55") wide, with a directional print/nap, cut on fold, for sizes 34–38 in all heights




Main fabric, 140 cm (55") wide, with a directional print/nap, cut on fold, for sizes 40–48 in all heights




Main fabric, 140 cm (55") wide, with a directional print/nap, cut on fold, for sizes 50–52 in all heights




Lining fabric, 140 cm (55") wide, with a directional print, cut on fold, for sizes 34–38 in all heights




Lining fabric, 140 cm (55") wide, with a directional print, cut on fold, for sizes 40–42 in all heights




Lining fabric, 140 cm (55") wide, with a directional print, cut on fold, for sizes 44–52 in all heights




Interfacing, 140 cm (55") wide, cut on fold, for sizes 34–38 in all heights

READY? LET'S GET SEWING!



Place the front and side front pieces right sides together. Align the princess seam edges, match the notches and marked intersection points, and pin.

Machine-stitch. The stitching line should start or end exactly at the marked intersection point. Backstitch at the beginning and end of the seam.



Clip diagonally into the seam allowance of the front piece, towards the intersection point. Stop 2 mm short of the seam.



Press the princess seam allowances open.
