ODELIA PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Odelia is a close-fitting dress with an underbust seam and a deep round neckline. The front bodice is gathered at the bottom and features applied plackets with a faux lacing detail. The dress is shaped with front and back waist darts. It closes with an invisible zipper in the center back seam. The set-in sleeves are long, flared toward the bottom, and gathered at the cap. Odelia is midi length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this dress, choose blouse and dress-weight fabrics with the following properties:

- · medium-weight, pliable, soft, opaque, non-stretch or low-stretch
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (silk, cotton), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (silk + polyester, cotton + viscose, etc.), and synthetics (polyester, polyester + elastane)
 - the following fabrics are recommended: dress-weight viscose, crepe, heavyweight silk.

Attention! We do not recommend stretchy knit fabrics or lightweight sheer fabrics (chiffon, organza, stretch lace).

The dress in the photos is made of crepe. The fabric is medium-weight, pliable, soft, with a little stretch. The fiber content is a blend of cotton and elastane. The fabric weight is 155 g/m2.

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front bodice cut 2
- · front skirt cut 1 on fold
- · back cut 2
- · sleeve cut 2
- placket cut 2
- placket lining cut 1
- front neck facing cut 2
- · back neck facing cut 2
- placket rouleau cut 1.

2. From interfacing:

- placket cut 2
- front neck facing cut 2
- · back neck facing cut 2.

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

Additionally, cut the following from interfacing:

- two 2 cm (3/4") wide strips to reinforce the zipper section of the center back seam allowances. Cut the strips to be as long as the interfaced area.
- one 3.5 cm (1 3/8") wide strip to interface the placket lining. The interfacing strips should be cut on the cross grain (perpendicular to the selvedge).

SEAM ALLOWANCES

All pattern pieces include seam allowances as follows:

- garment hem allowance 2 cm (3/4")
- sleeve hem allowance 2 cm (3/4")
- all other edges 1 cm (3/8").

Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.



Press the dart seam allowances toward the center back. Shrink out the fullness at the dart points.



With the right side facing up, overlock the center seam edges on the back piece.

Press the seams flat.



Place the two back pieces right sides together, align the center back edges, match the notches. Pin and baste. Machine-stitch the center back seam from the zipper notch down to the bottom edge of the garment. Backstitch at the beginning and end of the seam.
