JUNIOR ACADEMY

Immerse yourself in a busy schedule of enriching musical activity with like-minded musicians

On Saturdays, the Royal Academy of Music transforms into Junior Academy. Intensive one to-one lessons, a variety of performance opportunities, specialist classes and excellent teaching staff all add to the musical vibrancy.

Weekly activities are varied and might include:

- a one hour lesson in your principal study with a specialist teacher
- second study lessons, where appropriate (not included in the course fee)
- chamber ensembles coached by one of our teachers or a visiting musician
- classes to develop aural and theory skills, general musicianship and an understanding of style and form
- rehearsals and performances of standard orchestral repertoire, with concerto opportunities for outstanding instrumentalists
- choir
- masterclasses and workshops with distinguished performers
- a variety of performance opportunities for solo, chamber, choir and orchestral players, from weekly informal performance platforms to major concerts in the Academy and in venues across London

Other opportunities include keyboard skills, composition, conducting and Alexander Technique. There are annual competitions for each discipline and for chamber music, adjudicated by prominent visiting musicians.

JUNIOR JAZZ

Work with renowned performers and educators to develop your skills, confidence and passion for jazz

Established in 2003, our Junior Jazz programme accepts jazz musicians aged 14 to 18. Previous students include Joe Armon Jones, Jacob Collier, Kit Downes, Nubya Garcia, Michael Kiwanuka, Femi Koleoso and Alexandra Ridout

Working under the direction of Gareth Lockrane and Matt Anderson, you will receive a weekly small ensemble session and, over the course of the year, take part in masterclasses and workshops. In recent years, students have had the opportunity to work with Pete Churchill, Bokani Dyer, Adam Glasser, Dave Holland, Nikki Iles, Pete King, Dick Oatts, Jason Rebello and Gwilym Simcock, among others. You will also enjoy numerous performance opportunities, including a summer term concert at Soho Pizza Express or Ronnie Scott s Jazz Club.

Work is largely practical, with most learning and performing happening in small ensembles. You will focus on improvisation, the study of harmonic and rhythmic elements, and playing in a variety of styles.

The course also includes the arrangement of standard jazz tunes for ensembles, and the importance of the ear instrument relationship in jazz performance is strongly emphasised. You will be encouraged to listen to a wide range of genres

and will learn about some of the musicians of the past who helped to shape the development of jazz.

Completing the course will not guarantee you a place on the undergraduate jazz course at the Academy, but one of our key aims is to prepare students thoroughly for further specialist study, and graduates of the Junior Jazz programme have had an almost 100% success rate of gaining entry to one of the UK conservatoire jazz courses. We have close links with the senior Jazz Department, led by Nick Smart, and junior and senior students regularly work together.

JUNIOR ACADEMY MUSICAL THEATRE

Hone your acting, singing and performing skills with expert coaches

Junior Academy Musical Theatre (JAMT) is a new and developing course for 13- to 18 year-olds, where individuality is nurtured, diversity embraced, and students empowered to be creative and brave.


Our young artists make new friends, build confidence, find their voices and learn how to tell stories through song. They also gain the necessary skills to go on to further specialist training in musical theatre, should they choose to. Previous experience is not required – we re looking for potential, passion and talent.

Every Saturday, our students work in small groups, receiving tailored support from resident musical directors, theatre directors and artists to develop their talent. The timetable varies, with activities including:

- musical theatre repertoire
- acting through song
- ensemble singing
- drama
- character and text work
- movement
- audition technique
- workshops
- industry panel day

During the year, we invite industry professionals to lead exciting and inspiring masterclasses and workshops on specific shows or disciplines. Recent guests include Mark Hedges, Resident Director of *Mary Poppins*; Sam Hiller, Associate Director of *Les Misérables* and *The Phantom of the Opera*; and Jill Williams, Resident Director of *The Lion King*. Disney Theatrical Productions Scholarship alumni from the Academy s MA Musical Theatre course – some of whom have appeared in shows such as *The Prince of Egypt, Hamilton, Six* and *Come From Away* – also returned to work with students.

Each year culminates in a staged showcase performance in front of an invited audience, giving every student the opportunity to learn how to work in a professional theatre environment, with technical and dress rehearsals, lighting, sound and live music.



HEALTHY YOUNG MUSICIAN

Gain valuable skills that will sustain your physical and mental health and enhance your growth as a musician

Student wellbeing is vital, and at Junior Academy we take it very seriously. Our Healthy Young Musician course helps our musicians to approach performance growth in an effective and healthy way through performance psychology, Alexander Technique and much more.

Our aim is to build calm, confident and co-ordinated young musicians who can make good choices about how to look after themselves, both physically and mentally, and apply these skills not only to being a musician but to all aspects of their lives, now and into the future.

The course is open to all Junior Academy students, regardless of programme. Each session introduces knowledge, self awareness and tools through performance creativity. Among the areas we explore are:

- performance anxiety being calm and confident
- goal setting how to achieve your goals
- healthy perfectionism
- memorising confidently
- effective practice growing faster, in less time
- painless practice reducing the risk of injury

We also run a weekly one to-one active listening service. This allows students to share any worries they have, music related or otherwise, in a non judgmental space. The listener is trained to signpost students to a range of resources, to ensure that all students are supported both inside and outside the Academy.

In addition, we hold open Yoga classes three times a term, and run a young leader scheme that encourages older musicians to nurture, support and inspire their younger peers.

PRIMARY ACADEMY

Make the most of your musical ability in a friendly, supportive learning environment

Talented musicians aged 8 to 12 will thrive at Primary Academy. As well as developing musically, you'll have lots of fun with friends who, like you, really enjoy their music-making. It's a great way to spend your Saturdays!

In addition to your individual instrumental lessons with outstanding teachers, all of whom also teach in

Junior Academy, you will play chamber music, sing in the choir, improve your aural, theory and general musicianship and – if you are a string or wind player – play in a string or wind ensemble.



FIRST EXPERIENCES





FIRST STRING EXPERIENCE

The Junior Academy First String Experience (FSE) gives children as young as four the best possible start to their musical journey as string players. Now in its fourth decade, the course encourages basic musical skills, physical ease with the instrument and the enjoyment of playing through group tuition and ensemble playing.

The atmosphere is relaxed, friendly and nurturing, to ensure that the children get the most out of their learning. Each year group gives a concert at the end of every term.

There are 30 Saturday sessions over the year. In Year 1 of the course, students attend a 45 minute pre instrumental class on a Saturday morning; in Years 2 and 3, this extends to two hours.

FIRST GUITAR EXPERIENCE

The Junior Academy First Guitar Experience (FGE) welcomes children aged six to join our three year course, which gives them a unique opportunity to learn the guitar.

Using the Jigsaw Guitar Course devised by FGE director Luke Dunlea, the programme incorporates classical guitar and Kodály method based training, advancing the children's basic musicianship skills in areas of pulse, rhythm and pitch. Fun games and singing activities play a key part, and the lessons develop a solid foundation in classical guitar technique.

There are 30 Saturday sessions over the year. In Year 1 of the course, students attend a 45 minute pre instrumental class on a Saturday afternoon; in Years 2 and 3, this extends to one hour 20 minutes.

APPLICATIONS

Entry to the First String Experience and First Guitar Experience is by online application in late October, closing in early January. To promote equal opportunities, student applications are entered into a ballot and selected at random, so there is no guarantee of entry to these programmes.

Applications for all other programmes open in January and can be made using our online application form. Please check our website for the most up-to-date information on the application process, including closing dates for each programme.

AUDITIONS

The exceptional musical training we offer means that successful applicants must possess a combination of musicality, commitment and potential.

We want everyone who is successful at audition to be able to attend Junior Academy, so don't let finances stop you from accepting your place – means-tested bursaries are available. You will be sent information about how to apply for assistance following the audition process.
